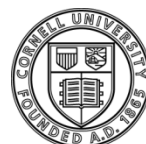


Prohibited and Regulated Invasive Species

6 NYCRR Part 575 Prohibited and Regulated Invasive Species

This abbreviated list only includes plants; the complete list includes animals, insects, and other organisms. **Effective March 2015**



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Prohibited: no person shall sell, import, purchase, transport, introduce or propagate any prohibited invasive species.

Regulated: no person shall knowingly introduce into a free-living state or introduce by a means that one knew or should have known would lead to the introduction into a free-living state any regulated invasive species, although such species shall be legal to possess, sell, buy, propagate and transport		Sale of these 6 “Regulated” species requires a specific label which includes alternative plants that are native or non-invasive. *NYSDEC and Cornell will be coming out with an updated booklet of alternative plants soon.
